General Summary and Intent of Bill:

Amends Child Protection Law, sec 7b of 1975 PA 238 (MCL 722.627b) Children Foster care education requirements for children placed in foster care.

This bill would allow certain child death records disclosure to parents under certain conditions. By the Child Fatality Review Team, (required in each county) shall release information concerning the cause of death of a particular child, to an individual who was the child's parent or legal guardian. Upon the individual's request, the child fatality review team must disclose the information described in this subdivision.

The child fatality review team may not release information to a parent or legal guardian who is criminally responsible for child abuse or child neglect that caused the death of the child and who is serving a sentence of imprisonment in a state or county correctional facility in this state or any other state, or in a federal correctional facility.
